Student Living Index 2018

Key Findings

- Students in Hull have the lowest Student Living Index, meaning they experience the best value for money when it comes to cost of living with respect to monthly income.
- Those in Liverpool struggle the most in terms of their income vs monthly outgoings, followed by those in London.
- Income level can vary up to nearly £400 between cities, with those in London having the most income and those in York having the least.
- Student loans are the main source of income for students. Parents/family are the next biggest contributor behind this, but only contribute about half as much on average.
- Academic study makes up the bulk of students time. They spend over three times as long working on their studies as socialising with friends.
- Students at Oxford and Cambridge universities are the most studious, spending 162 hours and 146 hours respectively. Behind this, the most studious university is St Andrews.
- Those at Durham University are the most sociable, they spend 48 hours a month going out with friends or socialising.
- Subject choice is the main thing that draws students to their choice of University, with 50% saying this is why they selected the university
 they went to. Portsmouth universities have particularly appealing course options, with 70% of students in Portsmouth saying that's why they
 went there.
- Most students don't feel that they have received much help from their university in managing their finances, with 39.5% of students in Stirling saying they feel no support from their university, and 38% of all students saying they received no discounts from their university.
- Belfast is one of the most expensive cities to be a student in, with students there anticipating the highest prices on beer.
- Students in Glasgow make the most money from working part time, and they also spend the most money on a night out at an average of £25.60.



Methodology & Sample

Audience

n = 3419 university students living in the UK

Respondents were given a small incentive to take part in an online survey. The survey was debranded for all respondents.

31st May – 15th June 2018







Students living in London pay the highest rent, with those in Belfast and Glasgow spending the least








Students in Hull receive the highest income from their student loan, in London, income from student loans is relatively low, being the 6th lowest in the UK

Q. "On average, how much does each of the following sources contribute to your income during term time each month?"





Students in Glasgow make the most money from term time work. Scotland seems to have one of the biggest groups of working students, having all three of the top locations for term time income



Academic study is the main way students spend their time, students spend over three times as many hours on academic studies than on socialising



Students studying Dundee and Stirling spend the most hours working part time


Q. "On average, how many hours per month do you spend on the following activities?" (Part time work)

Monthly Hours Part Time Work




Oxbridge students spend the most time studying out of all UK universities, followed by St. Andrews

London students spend the least time socialising, with Durham socialising the most


Q. "On average, how many hours per month do you spend on the following activities?" (Going out/Socialising with friends)




Monthly Spend on Going out/Socialising with Friends


Monthly Spend on Other hobbies and interests

Monthly Spend on Playing sports/at the gym





Subject choice is the main motivator for university choice, followed by University reputation



Stress of your university degree






Q. "On a scale of 0-10, where 0 is not at all and 10 is completely, how much are you enjoying studying for your university degree?"

Enjoyment of University Degree








The longer time students spend socialising, the more likely they are to enjoy studying



Support on managing money from University









NUS student cards are the most commonly offered discounts, but 38% say they received no discounts at all from their university








Pint – expected cost
